

History of Labor Neighbor Day

1959 – A new celebration based on the theme, "Let Labor Day be Neighbor Day". All good neighbors in the community are urged to stay off the highways on Labor Day, fire up the barbecues, and invite friends and neighbors in for a picnic 1967 – Cooking contests are added to the two-day celebration of Labor Neighbor Day 1983 – 15 minute fireworks show; Bike Race charged money to participate. Punt, Pass and Kick Competition 1988 – Activities for Labor Neighbor Day include: Potato Sack Races, Run Free Stay Free Races, Dunk Tanks

2010 – Activities for the one day event include: Pet Show; Bike Races and Wiffle Ball Tournament 2017 – Bike Races held at Hastings Track; Wiffle Ball Tournament held in the fields in between Northam Park and Tremont Elementary School; Pet Show discontinued
